

Developing your trauma skilled practice



How to access the National Trauma Training Programme e-modules “Developing your trauma skilled practice” using Turas learn

The trauma skilled e-learning modules of the National Trauma Training Programme, which are designed for *anyone* working within the entire Scottish workforce, sit within Turas Learn. The instructions below are designed to help anyone to register for Turas learn, log in, and navigate to the modules “Developing your Trauma Skilled Practice”

1. Registering for a Turas Learn account

To access Turas Learn you will first need to register for an account. You can do this on the Turas Learn home page here: <https://learn.nes.nhs.scot/>, using the register button at the top right hand corner of the screen (see Picture 1). When you start to register you will be asked to enter the “sector” that you work in.

If there is no clear sector (at the moment) that represents your own sector, we suggest you select “*other public sector in Scotland*”.

You will then be asked to enter the Professional group you work for. You can leave Professional Group and Professional Role blank, as these are not mandatory fields.

You can then enter your details and email address to start the registration process. Once you have followed this process you will be sent a registration email, where you can verify your email address and set your password.

2. Signing In to Turas Learn.

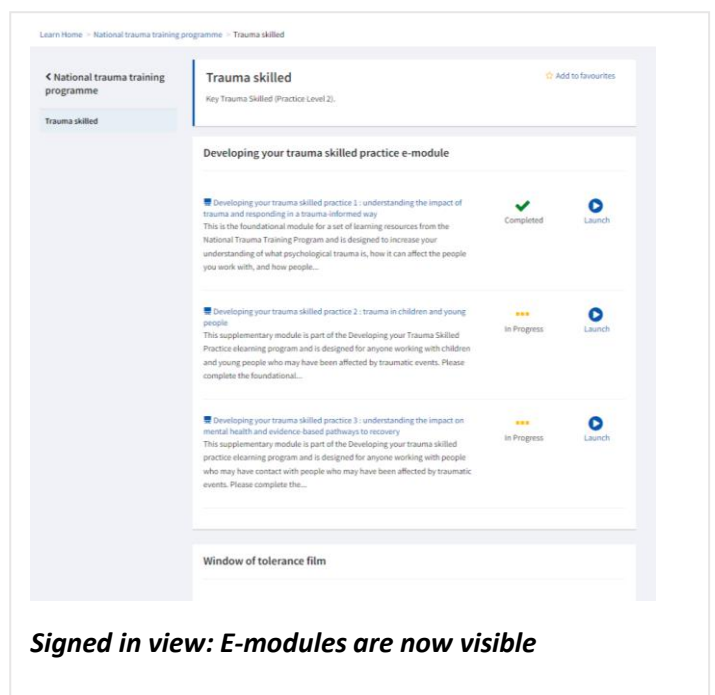
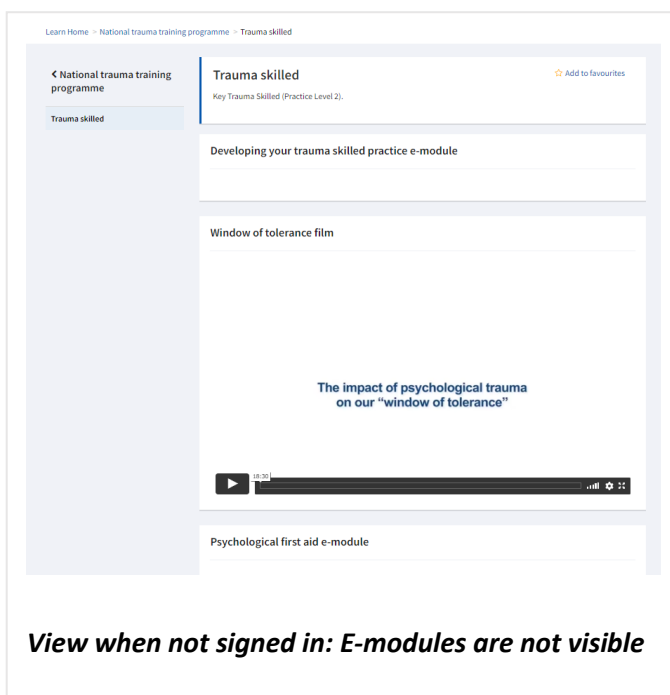
You can now sign into Turas learn with your email address and password, using the sign in button top right of the Turas Learn homepage (see picture 1). When you are signed in you will see your name instead of the sign in button.

Picture 1: Turas home page – top right Register and Sign In



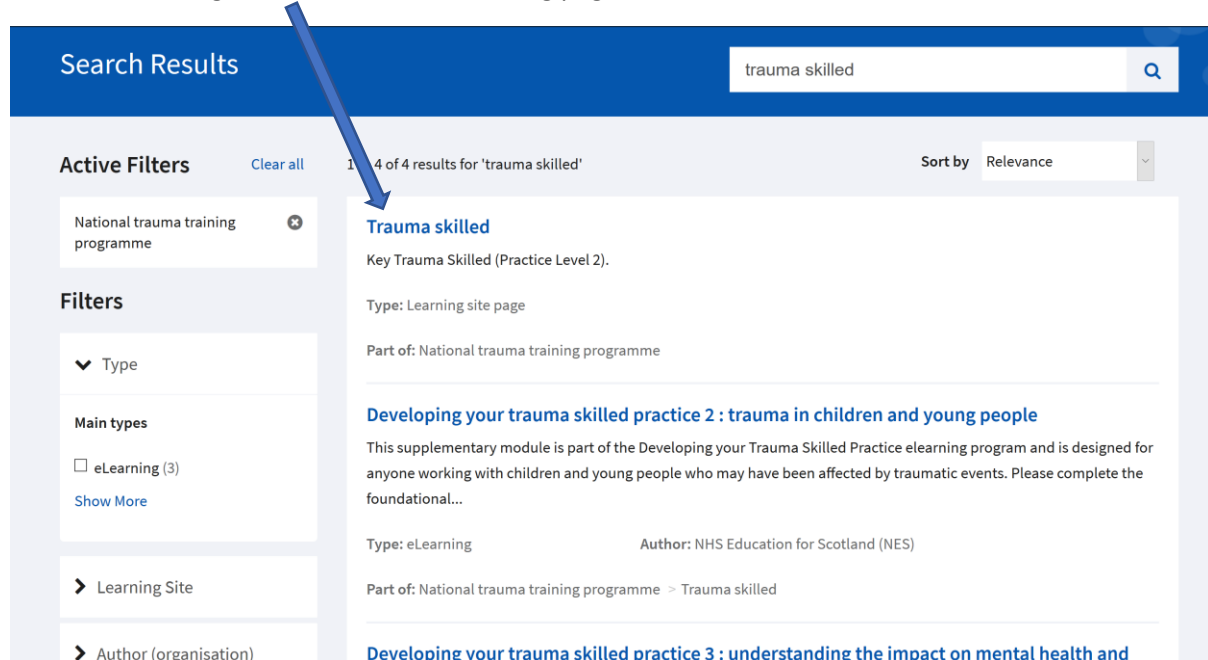
3. Accessing the Learning Modules.

Once you have signed in to Turas Learn, you can find the relevant e-learning modules on the Trauma Skilled page here: <https://learn.nes.nhs.scot/37899/national-trauma-training-programme/trauma-skilled>. The modules will ONLY become visible once you have signed in, see below. (You may need to sign in again after following the link in order to see the modules).



Alternately, whilst signed in, use the search box in Turas Learn to search for “trauma skilled” and select this option:

Click on “ Learning History” at the bottom, and you should then see a record of your activities including the modules you have completed. From there you can download the certificate (see picture 3)
